


Spring Term 2023 Dosbarth Ffenics: Celts and Vikings Homework Grid

Upload it to your Hwb folder and present it to the class like the teacher!</p> 	<p><u>Design a poster</u> for the younger classes to teach them about "How to Stay Safe Online" Make it bright and bold to be displayed on their walls. Consider cyber bullying and how to keep information safe.</p>

Record your fist score and see if you can beat your score.</p>	<p>Solve this problem: You need to bake a cake for a family member by 5pm. The cake takes 10 minutes to mix the ingredients, 30 minutes to cook and 25 minutes to cool. What is the latest you can bake the cake?</p>	<p><u>Roman numerals</u> In every row add just one matchstick to make the equation valid.
