


Autumn Term Reception Homework Grid

Please choose one piece of homework each week to complete. Make sure you choose homework from different sections of the grid and upload one piece of work to the HWB file 'People Who Help Us'. We will show in class each Monday.

<p>Language, Literacy and Communication</p> <p>English</p>	<p>Create a thank you card for someone who has helped you. Remember to try to use your best writing inside to say 'thank you' and write your name.</p> 	<p>Create a name badge for yourself; it could be a Doctors badge, Police Badge or any other job where people help us. Pretend you are the person who is helping. What would you do? What would you say?</p> 	<p>Practise what you would say if you were ever in an emergency and had to call 999. You could record a video and upload it to your Hwb folder.</p> 	<p>Reception - Begin to learn Phase 2 sounds. Start to learn how to read and write some of the phase 2. You could access Phonic Play https://www.phonicsplay.co.uk/</p> 
<p>Language, Literacy and Communication</p> <p>Welsh Cymraeg</p>	<p>Listen to a story in Welsh. You could use the free Magi Ann app to read stories.</p> 	<p>Listen and join in with a Welsh song. <p>Expressive Arts</p> 	<p>Create your own Emergency vehicle. Think about its features - sirens, hosepipes and ladders, bright colours. You could use old boxes, bottle lid tops and cardboard tubes. Alternatively, using paint or collage, make a picture of an emergency vehicle.</p>	<p>Compose and sing a song or preform a dance about a firefighter, policeperson or someone else who helps you.</p>	<p>Draw, paint and create a Person who helps us.</p> 	<p>Make a playdough, clay or sculpture of Someone who helps us.</p>

<p>Science and Technology.</p>	<p>Make a lifeboat and test it to see if it floats in the water</p>  	<p>Using JIT5 on Hwb, make a picture of a person helping someone else.</p> 	<p>Outside design a safe obstacle course to keep you fit; upload a photo of it onto your Hwb (j2launch) folder.</p>	<p>Design a Police Station with construction; upload a photo of it onto your Hwb (j2launch) folder.</p>
<p>Mathematics and Numeracy</p>	<p>Reception - practise counting objects reliably and matching the correct number to the amount of objects</p>	<p>Compare amounts of objects (such as toys, blocks, bricks, etc) using words like 'more than', 'less than' or 'equal to'.</p>	<p>Play teachers with your teddies or toys. Count how many are in school. Challenge: Make a video and upload it to your HWB folder!</p>	<p>Build a ladder from straws and blue tack, or any similar objects you might have. How tall can you make it? How many straws did you use?</p> 
<p>Humanities</p>	<p>Learn your address in case of an emergency</p>	<p>Interview family members who help you. You can draw a timeline of the things they do to help others. This may be a family member who has a career that helps others or a person who helps others at home.</p>	<p>Talk with an adult about our topic People Who Help Us (this could be people at home, at school, in the community)</p>	<p>Draw a picture of a person who has helped you in the last few weeks. Describe what they did to help you.</p>
